Hopefully you had a pleasant flight. Imagine you just landed in Krakow at Balice International Airport, passed the gates and successfully collected your luggage. Welcome to Poland! And what next?

LAST TIPS BEFORE LANDING IN KRAKOW

1. Should you have any question concerning getting to your hotel, currency exchange or public transportation rules – meet the **CinC Arrival Attendant** at the airport (with a CinC banner) – she or he will be there to help you.




2. There are THREE options of getting from the airport to your selected Hotel:

first is the taxi (20 min, ~60 ZL): my preferred company is 19191 directly from the front door of the airport international terminal – they ALWAYS use a meter and say the price at the end of the ride, most of them accept credit cards for payment, but no foreign currency cash. You can also take iCar, a private transportation company – they don't use meters, but say the price based on GPS distance BEFORE the ride.
second is the bus (40 min, 3,40 ZL): the stop is some 50 meters from the front door of the airport international terminal, you can take lines 208 (leave at 'Czarnowiejska' stop) or 292 (leave at 'AGH' stop), both stops are about 250 meters from the AGH-UST entrance.

third is the train (15 min 19 ZL): the terminus is some 300 meters right from the front door of the airport international terminal (a free shuttle is available). The train takes you directly to the main station in the downtown, which is 3,5 km from the AGH-UST entrance.

3. We don't use US Dollars or Euros in Poland – our **national currency is ZLOTY** [~zwoti]. The official exchange rates on the day of writing were 1 EUR = 4,0888 ZL or 1 USD = 3,3059 ZL. Exchange boutiques ('KANTOR') are very frequent in the downtown, most shops also accept credit cards (Visa or Mastercard).

4. Should you need your own electrical appliance (e.g. battery charger), first check if it complies with **230V 50Hz**. We use European standard wall sockets with two round holes 19 mm apart.



5. The meeting for **workshops participants** is Saturday, September 8-th, at 9:00 in front of U2 building, please identify yourself to the volunteer on duty.

6. The **registration desk** opens on Sunday, September 9-th at 12:00 in U2 building, please be registered before the departure to the Wieliczka Salt Mine and wear the CinC badge.
